**FORWARD PROMISE AWARDS \$3.15 MILLION IN GRANTS  
TO PROMOTE THE HEALTH AND SUCCESS OF BOYS AND YOUNG MEN OF  
COLOR**

*Amistades, Inc. among Nine Organizations to Receive Funding To Help BYMOC Heal,  
Grow and Thrive in the Face of Chronic Stress and Trauma*

Tucson – Forward Promise, a national grantmaking program of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, today announced grant awards totaling \$3.15 million to nine organizations across the United States that are helping boys and young men of color (BYMOC) heal, grow, and thrive. This first round of grant-making entitled, Empowerment Projects, will support organizations that provide culturally-relevant and evidence-supported responses to trauma for BYMOC in schools, health systems, juvenile detention, and community-based settings. These organizations help BYMOC overcome the effects of systemic and historical trauma linked to discrimination, oppression, dehumanization and prolonged exposure to violence, poverty and other forms of toxic stress.

Amistades, Inc. is one of the nine organizations selected to contribute to the Forward Promise Empowerment Projects. Founded in 2006, Amistades is a Latino non-profit community development organization committed to providing culturally responsive services, advocacy for social justice and community empowerment. Projects Familia Adelante, Mestizo Mentoring, and Save Our Sons, currently serve Latino boys and young men in schools and in community settings through psycho-cultural early interventions, cultural mentoring, and peer-led leadership development programs focused on building self-efficacy, self-sufficiency, and strengthening family ties.

Under the Empowerment Projects initiative, Amistades will help young Latinos explore their Mexican heritage and create a positive cultural identity to thrive in Southern Arizona.
